Stated Session Meeting Agenda

November 9, 7:00 – 8:30pm

The Stated Meeting of the Session of Madison Presbyterian Church was held at 7:00 on October 11, November 9, 2022 in the Fellowship Hall. Those present were Elders; Sue Strahan, John Quinley, Bill Pattie, Jean Pearson, Allan McLearn, Clarrisa Berry and Moderator; Karen Allamon. Elder Dana Edelman was excused. A quorum was present.

1. Gather with Scripture and Prayer:
2. Review and Approval of the Agenda: Jean made the motion, Allan seconded. The agenda was approved.
3. Pastor’s Report: Karen provided a written report of her activities for the month.
4. Clerk’s Report and Communications: The Minutes from October were reviewed and approved. Sue reminded the Session that we are required to review the roles annually. She will send the report created by a task force in 2020 for everyone to review. Sue also shared a report from Nick regarding Church locks and security cameras. There was much discussion but no motion for action. It was recommended that the Building and Grounds team develop a policy for keys. It was agreed that we need to re-key the outside doors. A commercial grade key pad lock should be considered on each building. It was suggested that a master list of keys should be created and monitored. The issue was tabled pending a functional policy.

**Personnel:** No report

**Building:** No Building report. Clarissa reported that she met with Sandra (Susan Broyles?) regarding the plan to store some totes in one of our mechanical rooms. She needs to store them until Easter. This request was approved at the October meeting.

**Finance:** Allan reported on the proposed budget for 2023. The finance team was pleased to have requests from most all of the teams. The 2023 Proposed budget was reviewed. Clarissa moved that we accept the budget with one change, line 5306 move to a 5200 line item for clarity. Jean seconded the motion and the motion passed. Clarissa proposed that we consider a 2024 Capital Improvement campaign to cover the cost of anticipated repairs. Bill Pattie reminded us that we have a Maintenance Replacement account with \$53,490. There is also a Building Property fund with \$29,051.

Allan further reported the credit limit on our credit card has been increased to \$5,500.

**Stewardship:** Dedication Sunday is planned for 11/20.

Jean proposed that the Annual Congregational meeting be on 11/27. Clarissa seconded the motion. Discussion included: our Annual Corporation meeting be held on the same day, presentation of the 2023 Budget, Names for new members of the Nominating committee will be raised from the floor. Bill reminded us that as he rotates off, a new session liaison needs to be elected. The motion carried.

Some tips for the Holiday season

**Wrapping Paper**

Cut back on wrapping waste by placing gifts in reusable bags or baskets. If you prefer traditional wrapping paper, try to find a brand with recycled content and then use any large pieces to wrap presents again next year. Between Thanksgiving and New Year’s, Americans produce an extra two billion pounds of garbage per week, much of which is gift packaging.


**Greeting Cards**

Purchase greeting cards made from recycled or tree-free materials. Americans send two billion holiday cards each year, so just a 1 percent reduction could save 15,000 trees.

**Giving Cash**

Don’t take the ATM receipt. ATM receipts are one of the top sources of litter on the planet. If everyone left their receipt in the machine (declined a paper receipt), it would save a roll of paper more than than two billion feet long, or enough to circle the equator 15 times.
