

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are entering not only into the month of Love, but into the month of Lent. It is an appropriate joining. "See from his head, his hands, his feet, sorrow and love flow mingled down" (Isaac Watts, "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross).

On Wednesday, February 22, we will enter into Lent with a brief evening service for Ash Wednesday starting at 5:30. The service will include the imposition of ashes.

This is an important opportunity to renew our connection to the mystical union of the Trinity, to be mindful of our mortality, and therefore to seek to fulfill that last command of Christ's, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35)

I know that you have love for one another. I have witnessed it. I see it in action. And God calls us to be mindful of the world that he loves as well, recognizing all as God's children, and therefore worthy of love, of the action of love such as we saw in Jesus – healing, feeding, pushing down evil, and sowing seeds of hope. 1 John 4 gives us this injunction:

"Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us, and his love is perfected in us. (1 John 4:7-12)

Our mission statement says that we are a church "Bringing God's Love and Hope to Life". Let us begin every morning of Lent with that as our charge for the day, and by doing so shine a joyful light in our world.

Stated Session Meeting Agenda

January 10, 2023 7:00 - 8:00

The Stated Meeting of the Session of Madison Presbyterian Church was held at 7:00 on January 10, 2023 in the Fellowship Hall. Those present, were Elders; Sue Strahan, Bill Pattie, Dana Edelman, John Quinley, Allan McLearen, Jean Pearson and Clarissa Berry. Moderator was Karen Allamon. A quorum was present.

1.Gather with Scripture and Prayer: Pastor Karen opened the meeting with Prayer

2. Review and Prioritize Agenda: The agenda was approved.

3.Clerk's Report and Communications: The Minutes from November were previously reviewed via email. Jean moved to approve the minutes and Dana seconded the motion. The minutes were approved. We had no meeting in December. Sue reported an "evote" on December 19, 2022 for unanimous affirmation to receive new members; Beth Klocker and Richard Henn, by letters of transfer. Sue discussed the need to conduct a Roll Review. She will review the records from our last review and discuss with the team involved at that time.

4.Pastor's report. Karen shared her plan to discuss Elder roles at our officer training on January 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### 6. Area & Team Reports

#### a. Administration:

- Finance: The finance team has an appointment with Edward Jones next week. The annual financial review is planned in February.
- Karen asked what our current practice is for memorial gifts. Jean made a motion to appoint the Church Administrator to send thank you notes and tax letters to donors and to record memorial gifts financially. John 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and the motion passed.
- Presbytery amount and distribution: We have budgeted \$3000 for the Presbytery and 300 for Theology. Clarissa made a motion to distribute our contribution quarterly. Jean seconded the motion, the motion passed.
- Pledge drive: Allan reported that we have received 26 pledges of \$99,739. Finance generally anticipated a 25% unpledged increase to that figure for budgetary purposes.

**Building:** Bill gave us an update lights, locks and security cameras. 2 cameras will be \$400 and Nick is willing to install them. Sue made a motion to allow B&G to purchase and install 2 cameras. Clarissa 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and the motion passed. Locks: To rekey all exterior doors will cost ~\$700. The crash door would be \$1000 or \$1500 if we want the Administrator to be able to let visitors in from her desk. Jean made the motion to permit B&G to contact a company to provide a high, medium and low estimate for changes to our locks. Sue seconded the motion and the motion passed. Bill will arrange a meeting to obtain the estimate. B&G was encouraged to come up with a "Key Policy".

#### b. Congregational Life: No report

#### c. Witness:

Mission – Clarissa reported that historically, our Church's mission work has been financial based rather than talent based. Our distributions are made at the end of the year. The team was unable to meet, as usual this year, due to scheduling conflicts. They have a meeting planned on 1/22, after Church. The agenda will include the goal to make allocations more regularly throughout the year. Clarissa wants to identify a "charity of the month" to highlight and support. She also wants to promote a non-monetary mission that we can participate in.

MESA's current status was discussed, as their future direction is unclear to us in light of the recent decision to close the thrift store and expand the Food Pantry. Karen agreed to call the Director to introduce herself and to invite her to come talk to us.

Clarissa also identified a discrepancy in the Pentecost offering of \$800 and questioned the \$700 Equal Exchange line item in the budget. The team will discuss this with the Administrator for clarification.

- d. Communications: Dana reported a cable has been rewired so it no longer crosses the floor in the Narthex. We expressed appreciation to Dana and his grandson for doing this work. The rewiring is noted to have improved our Mps. Dana indicated the team continues to do research into the performance of both the camera and the mics. Karen said she has the name of someone that should be able to help.
- 9. A moment of Thanksgiving for Dana and John as they rotate off of session
- 10. Next Stated Session Meeting: February 14. We have officer training and a Called Session meeting on January 15<sup>th</sup>.
- 11. Prayer and Adjournment: Jean moved that we adjourn, Bill seconded, the meeting was closed with prayer.
