Elizabeth Ann and I had <u>just</u> literally used the word "normal" in discussing how the church offering should be collected, how communion might be served.

Ok. It appears, as the saying goes, that normal is just a setting on the washing machine. Waiting for things to stop drifting doesn't make a dent in how time "like an ever-rolling stream" bears all our days away. There's a beautiful statement in the Bible from Ephesians 5 that says, "Redeem the time..." $\dot{\epsilon}\xi\alpha\gamma$ op $\dot{\alpha}\zeta\omega$. This is the same word that is used for Christ redeeming us.

How does one "save" time from evil the way that Christ claimed us? To avoid the 2023 "drifts" we must all listen to God. God has chosen us for a time such as this, in a place such as this, or we wouldn't be here. Listen to God. Intentionally make time to ask and listen for his plan for you, for your church, for your community. Live your whole life before him. God, like Pope Gregory, may change our time keeping so that our time is used in keeping focused on the kingdom that is already and not yet. Pope Gregory changed time keeping so that Easter could "properly" and always fall on the spring equinox. God changed time forever by giving us eternity through the work on the cross by Jesus Christ our Lord.

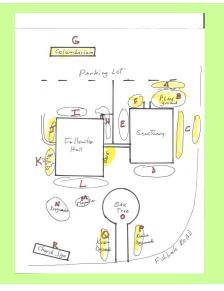
