Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Lent is here. Christianity Today says, "The season can be a beautiful and deeply moving experience of walking with Jesus to the cross." Where did this practice begin? Why is it important?

The word "Lent" comes from the Old English word for "lengthen", observing the lengthening of the days as we come into Spring. Well, that doesn't sound very religious!

Why then was this time chosen? "As a moveable feast, the date of Easter is determined in each year through a calculation known as computus (Latin for 'computation'). Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the Paschal full moon, which is the first full moon on or after 21 March (a fixed approximation of the March equinox). Determining this date in advance requires a correlation between the lunar months and the solar year, while also accounting for the month, date, and weekday of the Julian or Gregorian calendar." (Thanks Wikipedia!) That doesn't sound very religious either! As a matter of fact, it all sounds pretty man-made. And beloved, it is. But for this purpose:

Holy Week coincides with the Jewish celebration of Passover, the meal Jesus ate with his disciples before he was arrested and crucified. It is as close as we can get to the actual anniversary date that marks our redemption through Christ's sacrifice.

Marking the road to the cross by the 40 days of Lent is one way we engage the spiritual practice of self-examination, by considering Jesus' temptation and our own. The concept of "fasting" is a reflection of Jesus' hunger and accompanying refusal to stones into bread during his 40 days in the wilderness. The intent is that as we hunger for whatever we've given up for Lent – bread, Facebook, arguing - that we would remember Christ's sacrifice for us. The practice is not a "get to heaven" scheme. It is a tool for spiritual mindfulness as we use this time prior to Easter to go deeper with our Lord on the road to the cross.

Finally, Lent is 40 days. If you actually count the days between Ash Wednesday and Easter, you will come up with 46 days. Wait a minute! With all that calculation the church fathers couldn't count the days right?? No. Every Sunday is still a "little Easter". Every Sunday is still the Lord's Day. We are given a "day off" from our fast of – whatever you are doing – to refresh ourselves. (But if you're giving up arguing for Lent, please don't take the Sabbath off.)

Lent is a season of soul-searching and repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking stock. Lent originated in the very earliest days of the church as a preparatory time for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. By observing the forty days of lent, the individual Christian imitates Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for forty days.

With that in mind...let us read a reflection by William Arthur Ward entitled Fasting and Feasting.

Lent should be more than a time of fasting. It should be a joyous season of feasting. Lent is a time to fast from certain things and to feast on others. It is a season in which we should:

Fast from judging others; feast on the Christ dwelling in them.

Fast from emphasis on differences; feast on the unity of all life.

Fast from thought of illness; feast on the healing power of God.

Fast from words that pollute; feast on the phrases that purify.

Fast from discontent; feast on gratitude.

Fast from anger; feast on patience.

Fast from pessimism; feast on optimism.

Fast from worry; feast on hope.

Fast from complaining; feast on appreciation.

Fast from negatives; feast on affirmatives.

Fast from bitterness; feast on forgiveness.

Fast from self-concern; feast on compassion for others.

Fast from discouragement; feast on hope.

Fast from suspicion; feast on truth.

Fast from thoughts that weaken; feast on promises that inspire.

Saturday March 11 and Saturday March 18, both at 9:00


Please bring your own tools; pick-up trucks and trailers are welcome. Bring your gardening questions, too.
