

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Chase Tobin writes on Emergency Management from a Biblical Perspective, "From the Bible we are charged by the LORD God to be ready at all times. Not just for the returning of the Son of Man (Matthew 24:44), but to be watchful, steadfast, full of courage, steadfast, and strong (I Corinthians 16:13).

Preparedness is defined by DHS/FEMA as "a continuous cycle of planning, organizing, training, equipping, exercising, evaluating, and taking corrective action in an effort to ensure effective coordination during incident response." (DHS 2018) A community can do as much as they can to mitigate and attempt to prevent emergencies, but they are GOING to happen. Preparedness effectively enables a community to be ready with a plan and a contingency for whatever happens. It also enables them to be able to survive until the other phases of the cycle are able to be restored."

You have heard that your session has two Emergency Management initiatives underway to insure – as best as we are able – that our church will be a safe space, truly a "sanctuary". One of these feels difficult to say out loud: we are developing an Active Shooter plan. One of my friends from Seminary - who has developed plans for churches in New Jersey where she lives - is coming here and developing a plan for us FOR FREE. Rev. Annie Pantoja will be in worship with us on August 6, and will be meeting with the session on August 8. We will be joined at that meeting by our Presbyter, Rev. Dr. Flo Barbee Watkins.

The other initiative is a Readiness Task Force that will be working with the Red Cross to develop our readiness checklist for the kind of emergencies in which our community needs us. Serving on that team are Audrey Davis, Nick Humphrey, Valerie McLearen and John Quinley,. They will receive the orientation, fill out the readiness check list, and then report to session and ministry teams action that needs to be taken.

How about you? Are you ready for an emergency? I am not a "Prepper" as the common vernacular understands it, but I am a preparer. I just bought my kiddos water purification tablets, potassium iodide, and emergency meal rations. The kits have a 25 year shelf life so if the power grid doesn't fail until 2047 my grandchildren can still feed my great-grandchildren. The site also has specific preparation for chemical, radiation, and biological threats as well as severe weather. I am trained and certified by the Church of the Brethren for Childrens Disaster Services. I am happy to come and talk to you and your family in a positive way about getting ready.

And beloved, if you can, prepare for two families. We should always be ready to share with our neighbors, professing the love of Christ in and out of season. (And don't forget the toilet paper. Remember early Covid!)

Preparing for the worst – yearning for the best – trusting God in all of it.


