

WHAT'S SCARY? BAD INTERPRETATION!!!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ -

When asked to draw "Jesus flipping over the tables in the temple", Artificial intelligence produced this fine piece of art:



It is funny. But, as we discussed in Bible study the other day – interpretation does not happen in a vacuum. (Or, if it does, it is more likely to be mis-interpretation.) Our Presbyterian understanding of the authority of scripture has always been highly held. This is why we require a certain level of education and languages for our clergy. This is why Presbyterians built schools before they built churches – because protestants had fought for the right to read scripture – and not to merely hear it recited in Latin.

These days, driving up and down 29, I listen to Christian radio. The music lifts me up and keeps me focused on the Lord's work. Sometimes, when I spin the dial, there are sermons being preached. I listen. I often learn things. But I have found of sermons, like the little girl with the little curl right in the middle of her forehead – "when they are good they are very, very good and when they are bad they are horrid." What counts to me as "horrid" is when scripture is presented in a vacuum, like the picture above.


With today's AI, and algorithms dictating what comes up first on every search you perform on your computer, how will you judge whether what you are hearing is "the word of God rightly preached" (*from Calvin's Institutes*) or simply the "pleasing answer" to what scripture calls "itching ears" (2 Timothy 2:3)?

Just last week the world was predicted to end (again) on September 22 at midnight. As you know, because you are reading this, nobody got raptured. And if you read your Bible, you also know that nobody knows when that is going to happen. (*Matthew 24:36.*) Jesus says so. That's the most important part of scripture, what Jesus says. One good radio preacher applied that even to the letters of the New Testament. He said, "We should not interpret Jesus through the eyes of Paul, but interpret Paul through the eyes of Jesus." When we find what might be described as a "contradiction" in scripture – we allow scripture to critique scripture. Jesus, the Word en-fleshed, will always serve as the Way, the Truth, and the Light.

Your pastor hopes you are honing your ability to discern the truth of scripture by reading your bible, by attending bible studies, by exploring what you think and why when you hear a sermon, and by praying to the Holy Spirit, that you would hear no word but Christ's. "His word is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path."

EMERGENCIES call any time. PLEASE call or text directly if you or your loved one goes to the hospital, as soon as possible. Do not assume I know.


