

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Merry Christmas!

That's very Victorian way of greeting the season, which is where most of our Christmas traditions come from. I like Victorian traditions. My decorations include lots of red plaid and pine garlands with red berries. I have some tiny



tins from the Victorian Trading Company that aren't holding anything at all, they're just sitting out looking cute.

We've gotten so very used to our European-based traditions that other traditions can offend us because we think they're not about Jesus. For instance, the X in Merry Xmas. We can let ourselves get pretty het up over that! Important religious leaders like Franklin Graham do! "For us as Christians, [Christmas] is one of the most holy of the holidays, the birth of our savior Jesus Christ. And for people to take Christ out of Christmas. They're happy to say merry Xmas. Let's just take Jesus out. And really, I think, a war against the name of Jesus Christ. "What's with abbreviating Christ?!" "Don't take the Christ out of Christmas!" Oh Frank. They're not.

The 'X' comes from the Greek letter Chi, which is the first letter of the Greek word Christós

(Greek: Χριστός, translit. Khristós, lit. "anointed, covered in oil"), which became Christ in English. The suffix -mas is from the Latin-derived Old English word for Mass. It was Constantine who started using the first two letters of the word Christ – the Chi and the Rho – on his banners. You can see in the illustration to the left the Chi and the Rho, and it probably looks familiar to you. Many denominations had that sign on Christ related items, particularly in the 1970s.

So that's the story. Don't be offended by the X. Nobody's trying to X you out. Instead, why don't you unfurl your own banner after the call of the King of Kings? His banner over us is love. And that's our charge and our duty and our privilege, to love God with all our heart and mind and soul, and to love our neighbor as X has loved us.

If you want to drop by to see me instead of making an appointment, I will always be glad to see you. Just know you may have to wait if someone else has scheduled time.



Holiday concerts at 3:00 and 7:00 p.m. at the Stanardsville United Methodist Church 25 Court Street, Stanardsville, VA).



Dawn Redwoods



The Dawn Redwoods are an endangered species, yet ours are thriving, as is appropriate for an Earth Care Congregation. Unlike their California relatives, the Sequoia Redwoods, the Dawn Redwoods are not evergreen. Instead they turn a beautiful shade of copper in the fall before dropping their needles.

They were known in fossil records from the time of the dinosaurs, but thought to be extinct until a grove was discovered in 1946 in a valley in western China. Now they are available in many countries and are making a come back in America. As you can see from our trees, they can grow over 100 feet tall, and they may live one hundred years.
