

WHEN ASH WEDNESDAY FALLS ON VALENTINE'S DAY

A lot of my unchurched friends are saying, "Valentine's Day?!

Beloved,

Why on earth did the church decide to set Ash Wednesday on Valentine's Day?! We didn't. "They" didn't. What "they" did, the early church fathers, was to tie the date of Easter to the feast of Passover, as Jesus died after sharing the Passover meal with his disciples. And the date of Passover is set by the phases of the moon. "Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the Paschal full moon, which is the first full moon on or after 21 March (a fixed approximation of the March equinox)." https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Date_of_Easter

And if our friends are baffled by the date of Ash Wednesday, wait until they hear that the first Sunday after the Paschal full moon, Easter, falls on the 31st of March, the eve of April 1st this year!!! We will indeed be "fools for Christ's sake (1 Cor. 4:10)!" The equations regarding the date of Easter (Computus Paschal) is the practice on which the term "moveable feast" was based.

To begin our Lent this year we will "Eat, Pray, Love" on February 14th. We will gather for a light supper at 6:00 in the Fellowship Hall, followed by scripture, confession, and the imposition of ashes. We will dismiss no later than 6:50 - in time for the choir to get to practice. I hope you will join us as we usher in the season of Lent, remembering that though we are dust, our souls go to God out of His great love for us.



It is both intellectually and spiritually satisfying, and will lead us to consider aspects of our mortality that from a faithful and enriching viewpoint.

About the Booklet: "A sensitive discussion about the many forms of diminishment we experience in life including birth defects, illness, natural disasters, unwilled separations, aging, and finally death itself. From the author's study of Tielhard de Chardin and his experience of contemplative prayer, he invites the reader into practices of mind, body, and soul that may help open us up to God."

About the Author: Author John Yungblut is a graduate of Harvard College and the Episcopal Divinity School at Cambridge, MA. After serving 20 years in the Episcopal ministry, he joined the Religious Society of Friends, also known as the Quakers. Among others, he has served as the Director of Quaker House in Atlanta, a member of the faculty at Pendle Hill, and Director of Touchstone in Lincoln Virginia.




Social Services Needs for Families for February Needs of the Month: Infants & Children
