All those Bible folk had to learn to do new things. And many of them said, "I can't". Some of them said, "I don't want to." And those that said, "I won't" or "that's not necessary" got caught in frogs and locusts or a big ole' flood, respectively.




Friday April 19th at 9:00 a.m. - ONLINE SAFETY


